R2018-37: RESOLUTION SETTING OUT THE CITY'S 10 YEAR PLAN WITH RESPECT TO THE UNDERGROUNDING OF OVERHEAD UTILITIES.

Applicant/Purpose: Staff/ to prioritize future utility undergrounding projects.

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- <u>Brief:</u>
 - Companion item M2018-120 authroizes \$3,020,000 in the Underground Utility Fund for undergrounding related to upgrades to the Grand Strand campus.
 - The proposal sets out Council's Undergrounding Plan on a rolling 10-year basis.
 - The proposed strategy in the initial 10-year period is to:
 - o Complete undergrounding work along South Kings from 3rd S to the southern city limits.
 - o Partner w/ HGTC's proposed upgrades to the Grand Strand Campus (HGTC has agreed to pay related engineering costs).
 - o Prepare for connection of Highway 501 to Ocean Boulevard via 7th N by undergrounding utilities along 7th N (Kings to the Bouelvard).
 - o Begin undergrounding on Kings from 21st N to the northern City limits.

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Issues:

- Per the proposed resolution Council finds that:
 - o Undergrounding of utility lines is more esthetically pleasing, more operationally sound, & provides a higher degree of safety.
 - o Projects should continue to emphasize the City's commercial corridors.
 - o The City will prioritize partnership opportunities.
 - The Manager shall review the progress of this plan annually to make updates & to recommend changes for Council's consideration.
- The proposed strategy after the initial 10-year period is to:
 - o Complete undergrounding along North Kings to the northern city limits.
 - o Address undergrounding needs along important transportation corridors/commercial areas such as Highway 15, 21st N, & Carver.
 - o Ocean Boulevard undergrounding to the northern City limits.
 - o Begin conversion in the avenues between Kings & Ocean Boulevard.

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<u>Public Notification</u>: Normal meeting notification.

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Alternatives:

- Modify the proposed plan.
- Do not adopt the plan. Continue to consider underground projects on an ad hoc basis.

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Financial Impact:

- The proposed plan is funded entirely by the Underground Utility Fund financed by 20% of the Utility Franchise Fee paid by Santee Cooper.
- The current balance in the Fund is ~ \$8.6 million. Fund deposits are projected to be ~ \$2.0 million/year over the 10-year period, for a total of \$28.6 million.
- The Plan assumes projects estimated at \$27.1 million over this same time span.

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Manager's Recommendation: I recommend approval.

RESOLUTION SETTING OUT THE CITY'S 10 YEAR PLAN WITH RESPECT TO THE UNDERGROUNDING OF OVERHEAD UTILITIES.

WHEREAS, Santee Cooper pays the City an annual utility franchise fee in the amount of five percent of gross revenues for the privilege of providing electrical service to the residents and businesses in the City of Myrtle Beach; and

WHEREAS, of that amount 80 percent of the total is distributed directly to the City's General Fund and 20 percent is retained by Santee Cooper for the purpose of funding the undergrounding of overhead utility lines; and

WHEREAS, Santee Cooper has also agreed to match the City's contribution for undergrounding utilities; and

WHEREAS, and the balance of the "Underground Utility Fund" retained by Santee Cooper was estimated at \$8.6 million as of June 30, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

- 1. The City Council of the City of Myrtle Beach finds that further undergrounding of overhead utility lines is more esthetically pleasing, more operationally sound, and provides a higher degree of safety than the overhead placement of such utility lines and therefore desires to continue undergrounding such utilities as financial resources shall allow pursuant to the priorities established in this 10-year plan.
- 2. Such improvements should continue to emphasize the City's commercial corridors.
- 3. The City will look for opportunities to partner with private businesses, other units of government and educational institution in making such undergrounding improvements.
- 4. The existing balance and estimated deposits into the Underground Utility Fund (as shown in Attachment 1) are estimated to be approximately \$28.6 million in the 10-year period beginning July 1, 2018.
- 5. The prioritized projects to be funded by this plan (as shown in Attachment 2) are estimated to cost approximately \$27.1 million over the same time period.
- 6. Future undergrounding projects are shown in Attachment 3 of this resolution.
- 7. The map of all areas in the City where utilities have been placed underground is shown in Attachment 4.
- 8. On or about September 1 of each year the City Manager shall review the progress of this plan, update the map, projections and cost estimates contained herein, and recommend changes for City Council's on-going consideration.
